<p>Once we finish a Unit, students sit a test on grammar and vocabulary from that Unit, in which orthographic correction and precision will be required.</p> <p>A final term exam will include Reading with comprehension questions, Writing and Listening Skills, plus a grammar and/or vocabulary revision. Whenever necessary, last unit term will be included into the final term exam</p> <p>Students will have to produce at least a writing per unit in which they will work on different aspects (see above)</p>	<p>On the second term, students will cope with a reader (see above), a book adapted to their level and they will have an exam about it in which comprehension will be evaluated.</p> <p>On the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> terms the final term exam will have a value Of 45% of the final mark, from which grammar will be approximately 30%, reading 30%, writing 30% and listening 10%. Each of the unit exams will be 15% of the total mark and Class and homework (writings) plus attitude will totalise the remaining 10%.</p> <p>On the second term, as they will be asked to read a book apart from the textbook units, percentages change accordingly: 35% for the final exam, 15% each of the unit exams and 10% for the reader. No changes on the remaining 10%</p> <p>No average will be made if a student doesn't get at least 4 in the final exam. Consequently, that will mean a fail. Procedure and Content percentages are approximate, as both will be mainly measured through the same tools.</p>
